## 717 Secretary and Treasurer's Report

JN had distributed samples of the pens purchased for publicity purposes at the start of the meeting.

The Minister for Sport is keen that deserving candidates for honours are identified at grassroots level, particularly volunteers. Honours are a way to recognise outstanding merit and bring publicity to the sport. Clubs are asked to consider proposing individuals.

The committee discussed the future of the SCOA Championships. This year's event had been held in October at a Southdowns Regional event. Attendance was poor, as it had been in recent years. The low attendance, frequently only one or two in a class, devalue the championship and the secretary recommended discontinuing it. Part of the problem may be that the event is held outside the region so that all members of SCOA have the opportunity to run. Clubs are therefore asked to consider 1) should we continue with the Championship and 2) should it be held at an event within the SCOA area.

## 718 Fixtures Secretary's Report

SCOA are due to host the Southern Nights Championships in 2008 and the Southern Championships in 2009. Suitable venues and organisers are needed.

Some events have taken place before they are registered with BOF through a Regional Fixtures Secretary. These events would not be covered by insurance in the event of a claim.

BOF will have been in existence for 40 years in 2007 – ideas on how to celebrate are requested.

The Major Event Forms have been simplified.

#### **BOC 2009:**

The likely date will be 14/15 March 2009 to avoid any restrictions caused by ground-nesting birds. Possible areas for the Individual and Relay events had been identified together with a possible event centre. We need to appoint a co-ordinator and organisers for the individual days. The proposed Event Centre would need to close to other customers if we used it, so we need to confirm our intentions as soon as possible. It is not necessary to hold a Trail-O or Sprint event alongside the BOC but RS will check on requirements.

DS expressed thanks to DH who has done a good job in supporting SOC's Clubmark application and liaising with schools.

# 723 British Orienteering Vision Statement

The consultation document on the vision for British Orienteering was discussed. A wide-ranging discussion took place with sometimes divergent views.

We agreed that there are few sports like orienteering where people of all ages and abilities can compete together. Indeed mixed ability pairing in schools is beneficial to both parties.

We also believe that the sport's environmental credentials are under-played. It should be our aim that Orienteering is something that landowners welcome due to it's low footfall and low impact on the environment.

We generally agreed with statements 1 - 3 and, to a certain extent, 4 - 9 although there are some specifics such as the percentage increase in participation and 'top 10 representation in ALL age categories', that need to be achievable if included in the final statement.

Whilst inspirational statements are necessary parts of a vision statement, we would like to see something that is a firm target, challenging us as a sport. For example, something along the lines of "orienteering being firmly established within the national curriculum in all schools in the next 10 years. Also, we might include firm targets for increasing the number of races in different formats (Sprint, Park, City, Trail, Bike) as a means of increasing the popularity and range of people who go orienteering.
